Kelbrook & Sough Neighbourhood Plan – Project Proposal

Ancient Woodland Identification and Registration

31/01/2019

Justification

At present there is no record of the ancient woodland (that which existed as woodland before 1600) in the parish of Kelbrook & Sough. To assist in determining preferred development land, green space and conservation areeas within Kelbrook & Sough there would be great benefit in having an understanding of the ancient woodland within the parish.

Proposal

- 1. to register with the Woodland Trust those areas of woodland which are Ancient Woodland.
- 2. To create a legacy database which may be owned and made publicly available under the auspices of the Parish Council as a local asset.

Outline Process

- 1. Produce a comprehensive project plan
- 2. From the 1848 OS Survey identify wooded areas which still exist.
- 3. Using Hooper's rule, as modified by the Woodland Trust for upland woodland by using upland indicator wild plant species, identify the areas which are Ancient Woodland
- 4. For those areas not shown as significant on the 1848 OS Map use Hooper's rule to further identify any Ancient Woodland areas.
- 5. Photograph identified area and illustrate on reference map.
- 6. Verify with the Woodland Trust
- 7. Register with the Woodland Trust
- 8. Show Ancient Woodland areas on the Parish Council web site.
